🌟 What Google Translate Can Do (and how to use it)

📄 1: The Type & Show Method

- Type what you want to say in English in the top box.
- The app instantly translates it into the local language in the lower box, so you can show the screen to the person you're speaking with (great for restaurants, shops, taxis, pharmacies).

💬 2: Conversation Mode

- This is ideal when you need a quick two-way exchange.
- You can speak in English, and the app translates out loud or on-screen into the other language.
- Then the other person speaks, and it translates back to English.

📷 3: Instant Sign & Menu Translation

- Use the camera feature to point at a menu, sign, label, or instructions.
- The app overlays the translation on your screen so you can understand what you're looking at without typing anything.
- This is especially handy for menus, transit signs, and grocery items.

⬇️ 4: Offline Translations (a must for travel days)

- Before your trip, you can download the language for offline use.
- That way you can still translate even if you don't have cell service, you're avoiding roaming, or you're in a spotty area.

📌 5: Saved Phrases and Favorites

- If you find yourself repeating common phrases (water, check please, no peanuts, I have an allergy, where is the bathroom), you can save translations so they're ready instantly.
